Subject: 2d Infantry Division Command Policy Letter #10-3, Prohibited Substances

1. This policy supersedes 2d Infantry Division (2ID) Command Policy Letter #10-3, dated 16 November 2013, and any other 2ID policy letters or orders on the subject.

3. Applicability. This Policy is applicable to all 2ID Soldiers, all Soldiers subject to the 2ID General Court-Martial Convening Authority, and all 2ID civilian employees, invited contractors, technical representatives, and family members. This policy is punitive and violations of its provisions may result in punitive actions against service members, and adverse administrative actions against service members, civilian employees, invited contractors, technical representatives, and dependents. Failure to comply with the prohibitions contained in this policy is a violation of Article 92, UCMJ.

4. Background. A disturbing trend of abusing substances not listed as controlled substances (Title 21, United States Code section 812), but that are capable of producing excitement, intoxication and/or stupefaction of the central nervous system, has emerged in Korea among 2ID personnel. Many of these substances are illegal in

Korea and also fall within the purview of references a thru g. The use of these substances is detrimental to good order and discipline, mission readiness, and the overall effectiveness of this command and its Soldiers and civilians.

5. Prohibition. This policy prohibits the actual or attempted use, possession, purchase, introduction, importation, manufacture, and distribution of:

a. Synthetic psychoactive or psychotropic substances. These substances include, but are not limited to, controlled substances analogues, (e.g., designer drugs such as "Spice" that are not otherwise controlled substances). Any controlled substance analogue or homologue containing synthetic cannabis, any THC substitute, or any synthetic cannabinoid (e.g., Genie, K2, Skunk, Spice Diamond, Spice Gold, Spice Silver, Yucatan, Fire, and Zohai);

b. Naturally occurring intoxicating substances (e.g., Salvia Divinorum or any substance containing it, such as Diviner's Sage, Magic Mint, Maria Pastora, Sage of the Seers, Sally D) that are capable of inducing excitement, intoxication, and/or stupefaction of the central nervous system;

c. Chemicals, propellants, or inhalants (huffing) when used for purposes other than for which they were originally intended;

d. Dietary supplements that are banned by the United States Food and Drug Administration;

e. Prescription or over-the-counter medications, and over-the-counter dietary supplements, when used in a manner contrary to their intended medical purposes or in excess of the prescribed dosage or recommended serving size; and

f. Paraphernalia associated with the above mentioned substances. Paraphernalia includes any equipment, product, or material of any kind which is primarily intended or designed for use in manufacturing, distributing, compounding, converting, concealing, producing, processing, preparing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a substance intended to produce a psychotropic "high."

6. This proscription does not extend to the lawful use of alcohol, tobacco, or caffeine products, and their associated devices.
