



Sexual Assault Response Report Flow Chart



THE VICTIM CONTACTS
SEXUAL ASSAULT RESPONSE
COORDINATOR (SARC), SAPR VICTIM
ADVOCATE (VA), OR HEALTHCARE
PERSONNEL (HCP)

SARC notified and assigns SAPR VA

Ensure victim safety, seek
emergency care and preserve evidence

Note: A victim who first contacts law enforcement or chain of command will have only the Unrestricted Report option.

Unrestricted Report

Restricted Report
Does NOT trigger investigation

Note: At any time, the victim may switch a Restricted Report to an Unrestricted Report

Legal Services of Special Victims
Counsel (SVC) / Victims Legal
Counsel (VLC)

SAPR VA provides
ongoing, nonclinical
support

Victim receives
timely updates on case status from
commander, SARC, or VA within 72
hours at conclusion of monthly SARB

Notify
(SARC, VA, HCP, Command, CID)

Victim receives medical care and (upon request)
Sexual Assault Forensic Exam (SAFE)
Civilian medical facilities may
automatically notify law enforcement

Notify
(SARC, VA, HCP)

SARC reports non-personally
identifying information to the
commander

SAPR VA provides ongoing,
nonclinical support
